8. <u>Deborah Dees, CPA/CFF – Deliver Annual Financial Audit Report for the Year</u> Ended December 31, 2018

Ms. Deborah Dees, CPA/CFF, a principal in the accounting firm of Dees Gardner Certified Public Accountants, LLC, presented the audited financial statements of the Sabine Parish Police Jury for the year ended December 31, 2018. The Police Jury received an unqualified opinion on the Primary Government financial statements, the best opinion that can be given by the auditor.

Ms. Dees discussed the highlights of the financial report. The total net position of the Police Jury increased by \$1,676,835 during the year ended December 31, 2018. During 2018, the Police Jury expended \$6,062,399 for road repairs and improvements.

10.<u>Discuss Bridge Ratings Within the Parish and Award Contract for Preparation of Bridge Ratings</u>

Secretary Treasurer Weatherford called the Louisiana Department of Transportation and Development and spoke with Ms. Jenny Fu. She confirmed that there are forty-five (45) unrated bridges in the parish. Of those bridges, forty-one (41) were built by the Department of Transportation and will be load rated by LADOTD at no cost to the parish.

Four (4) bridges were not built by the DOTD. Ms. Fu informed Mr. Weatherford that the LADOTD has prepared a contract to load rate these bridges at a cost of \$5,000 each. However, the LADOTD will allow the parish to engage an independent engineer to perform the load rating.

Middle Creek Road:

Road Superintendent Hughes noted that a 25 MPH speed limit has been discussed for Middle Creek Road. An ordinance will need to be passed to allow enforcement of a lower speed limit. Consideration of this item was tabled until the next regular meeting.

15(a). Discuss the Landfill Contract

Mr. Matt Crockett, Regional Engineer with Waste Connections, Inc., addressed the Police Jury. He informed the Jury that the landfill has an additional thirty-nine (39) years of life at the current usage level. There is currently nine (9) years capacity of constructed airspace at the landfill.

He explained that Waste Connections, Inc. has established a liability account in the amount of 1.7 million dollars for post-closure costs associated with the Sabine Parish Landfill.

Mr. Emely assured the Jury that Mr. Crockett is available to meet with the jury at any time.
